


Tummy Girl! illustrated by Sam Williams (Ages 3-7)

Red is a Dragon: A Book of Colors, illustrated by Grace Lin (Ages 3-7) 2002 Best Children's Book Award, University of Wisconsin Cooperative Children's Book Center Second in the series

In this lively concept book, a little girl discovers a rainbow of colors in the world around her. *Red* is a dragon in the Chinese New Year parade, *green* are the vegetables in her garden and *white* are dumplings and chopsticks. Rhyming text and an informative glossary.

One is a Drummer: A Book of Numbers, illustrated by Grace Lin (Ages 3-7) Third in the series

The world around us is filled with things to count! *Three* are the dim sum carts filled with yummy treats, *four* are *mahjong* players and *eight* are the candles on a birthday cake. Many of the objects are Asian in origin, but all have universal appeal.
